A letter to the parish -

Dear Saints,

It is human nature to set goalposts in life and then set our hopes on that goal. When we are adolescents, we can't wait to get out of high school, then it is college, then it is "get married and settle down" and so on. As a result of fixing our gaze on the next goal to achieve, we lose sight of the road we're on. This letter is about the road we travel together.

Every group whether it is a church parish, a city, a business or school, has its own story. All stories include founding stories, setbacks, some triumphs and occasionally, backsliding. The narratives often create social norms and boundaries. For example, the mythology of George Washington as a boy and the cherry tree celebrates values of honesty, hard work and truth-telling. Sometimes the stories include dark times that are told in whispers; stories that people would prefer to forget. And sometimes, dark stories are twisted to become triumphal stories of great pride. The "sooner" story in Oklahoma is one of those.

Stories mark the points along the journey that stand out, that are worth remembering and re-telling future generations. Stories can also be biased, only telling the good things and not the bad. And, from time to time, the trajectory of a story needs to be shifted, taking aim at a new point on the horizon.

The founding era of this parish spans three decades from 1893 to 1923. It includes the 1917-1918 pandemic but that is scarcely mentioned as World War I eclipsed the pandemic in this town. We have few hard facts about those days except for names of founders, leading members of town, priests, and bishops and perhaps, that is just as well.

The stories of the founding era of Muskogee contain the seeds of deterioration that is plainly visible today. That narrative also needs to be pointed in a new direction, but that is not our task.

The earliest Christians called themselves "the way," a term in Greek which meant the same in Jesus' day as it does now. You can see it on street signs in modern Athens. It simply means "street." The implication of calling a group of fervent believers in the resurrection of Christ, "the street" is that they are on the road. They are on a journey. And those of us at Grace Episcopal Church in Muskogee today are on a journey too. At 125 years of age, this church has seen the wealth of our surrounding neighborhood decline by 300%. Yet, Grace Episcopal Church remains in the same location, now a "downtown, urban church" by most demographic definitions. I am proud of this parish for intentionally staying downtown. It is a bold move that few congregations are willing to stomach. Bolder still was the decision to remodel the facility when most of the nearby properties are falling down.

Staying in the same place in the midst of decline raises uncomfortable questions that grind against the founding stories. Questions such as, "Who are these people coming through our doors now?" And "Do we welcome them as members, as fellow people of God, or do we treat them as clients needing money for emergencies, food, shelter or other basics?" Most groups including religious congregations have unofficial "gatekeepers" whose approval or disapproval ensures that the uncomfortable question never has to be asked. Today, that question confronts us head on.

One of the unfortunate missteps of Christian missionary work is the tendency for one group with power and money to believe that they are doing something positive "for" another group that may have less worldly power or money. At its best such an attitude is ignored. At its worst, the attitude is considered to be condescending by the receiving group. The Grace congregation that I have known for the past ten years has seldom come across as "doing something for" others. Most of the time, this church reaches out in solidarity to others believing that we are "sharing something with" others. For living out that vital distinction, I am enormously proud of this congregation.

For most of my twenty years as a priest, I have wished the bible gave us some guidance on how to deal with those who come through the church doors with nothing but lies in order to scam the rich church. Now, I realize that we do have some guidance. Jesus healed ten lepers and only one turned around to praise God and give thanks. In a similar way, we may give aid and comfort to nine scammers and one legitimate need. We should never let those statistics deter our impulse to give. Because in our giving, we receive the spirit of God.

Now, we must consider the distinction that drives our giving impulse. Are we "doing something for" others or are we "sharing something with" them? I cannot tell you enough times that I am proud of this congregation for sharing with others. And that distinction answers our uncomfortable question. Grace Episcopal Church in Muskogee no longer needs gatekeepers. Our trajectory, our mission, and the road we're on is shifting before us.

There are no longer two camps of "them" and "us." We no longer have clients needing our assistance and members of the church as if we were a social services agency. We are one body, united in Christ. We are all branches on the vine. We are all either saints already or we have the God-given capacity to become them. We all stand as sinners before God whether we are scammers lying to get money for drugs or the saintliest among us. We all stand in need of God's mercy. Grace Muskogee reflects that reality by extending Christ's welcome to everyone.

I want to give you a vision of the future. I know this is possible because I watched a poor congregation in Watertown Massachusetts reach out to their community and do it. The future will necessitate changes in how all kinds of churches are operated, funded, and governed. By welcoming the community around us, these pews will be filled with one hundred or two hundred people. Money will not matter so much. The congregation will be diverse and alive. The Holy Spirit will be here along with the people.

By reaching out in solidarity with others, Grace Muskogee will be the living embodiment of the Beatitudes. Grace will be the church of the blessed – the poor in spirit, those who mourn, the meek, those who hunger for righteousness, the merciful, the pure in heart, the peacemakers, the persecuted, and the rejected.

For the blessed people that you are, for who we are becoming, I am proud of Grace Muskogee and I am ever thankful to be your priest.
