#### The Liturgy of the Word

The English service of lessons and carols in Advent originated in Cornwall, in southern England, where Bishop Edward Benson created the liturgy to be sung at his cathedral in the city of Truro. In 1918 the service was adapted by Eric Milner-White for Kings College, Cambridge, and in that form it has become a beloved tradition in many cathedrals and parishes in England and North America. The lessons provide for focus on the creation and re-creation (or redemption) of humankind, especially the words of the prophets proclaiming God's promises of a "new heaven and a new earth" through the coming of the Messiah. This year's program is centered around the seven "O Antiphons" (also called the "Greater Antiphons" or "Major Antiphons") which are prayers that come from the Breviary's Vespers during the Octave before Christmas Eve, a time which is called the "Golden Nights." Each Antiphon begins with "O" and addresses Jesus with a unique title which comes from the prophecies of Isaias (Isaiah) and Micheas (Micah), and whose initials, when read backwards, form an acrostic for the Latin "Ero Cras" which means "Tomorrow I come." Those titles for Christ are:

An antiphon (<u>Greek</u> "opposite"+"voice") in Christian music and ritual, is a "<u>responsory</u>" by a choir or congregation, usually in <u>Gregorian chant</u>, to a <u>psalm</u> or other text in a religious service or musical work.

# **Advent Candle Lighting**

- Reader 1: According to tradition, each candle has a special meaning. The fourth candle symbolizes love. Christmas happened because of God's great love for all people.
- Reader 2: "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life." John 3:16.
- Reader 1: At Christmas, God gave us the best gift ever. He sent his Son, Jesus, to live among us and show us the way.
- Reader 2: During this week, take a moment to reflect on God's love in Jesus as our greatest Christmas gift.

All four candles are lit and all say:

People: Four candles, burning bright, chasing away the darkness from light. Four candles, glowing light, the blessing of God, giving new sight.

People: You come to your people and set them free.


#### **Collect For Purity**
