**Godly Play** is always a special treat for the youth of Grace Episcopal Church. While regular Sunday Services are taking place in the Sanctuary, our youth meet in the Education Wing to enjoy lessons, crafts, and treats. The program is led by coordinator Pamela Lipscomb and presenter Patrick Shea with a host of other volunteers that enjoy bringing special treats or assisting in the development of innovative approaches to keep our young people interested, engaged, and happy to enjoy the opportunity to further their own development.

**EFM** is based out of the School of Theology at the University of the South at Sewanee. It is a unique four-year small group formation program based on study and practice in theological reflection. We have had learners participating at Grace Episcopal Church for the last 20 years!

**Book Club** provides an opportunity for fellowship while discussing insights and reflections about the selected work. Participants are committed to learning from each other's diverse prospectives and strengthening relationships through shared understanding.




# **OUR CAMPUS**

# Our Community (MUSKOGEE)

**Grace Episcopal Church** is located in the historic downtown district of Muskogee, Oklahoma.

Muskogee is a diverse community with small town charm, a close proximity to larger cities, and immediately surrounded by small towns. It is the perfect place for you to grow and flourish, with endless opportunities for outreach.

In addition to being one of the most affordable cities in the country to live, Muskogee has wonderful neighborhoods, both historic and new, a national blue ribbon school, a new high school sports complex, tennis & pickleball courts, a golf club, a new hospital, a veteran's hospital, Indian resources & health clinics, scenic parks, a butterfly house, museums, music hall of fame, a winery, splash pads, a water park, and numerous nearby rivers and lakes.

In 2024, Muskogee secured the top position in Oklahoma for capital investment, raking #1 in the state with over 4.1 billion in announced projects.





# **OUR HISTORY**

Grace Episcopal Church has served the Muskogee community for over 130 years. Beginning with the first service on February 23, 1893, Grace has been dedicated to bringing people together in a loving relationship with God and each other in Christ.




Grace's first, small church on South Fourth Street opened for services April 14, 1895.

The original Sanctuary constructed in 1905 could not accommodate the growing membership. In 1922, the Sanctuary - the structure itself - was moved to the corner of Sixth and Court Streets, and it was expanded.

Since 1922, our Sanctuary has continued to expand into our present-day "campus." In the decades that followed, Grace's leadership would continue to acquire, construct, and renovate adjacent and various other nearby properties that now constitute the Grace Campus.

# **OUR STABILITY**

### **Grace Heritage Society**

The Grace Heritage Society was started in 2023 during the celebration of the 130th anniversary of our Church's founding. Grace's thorough and extensive record-keeping enabled us to identify those who had included our Church and its mission in their estate planning throughout our long history. We then shared their stories and their impact on our church to encourage current members to consider incorporating Grace into their own estate planning. The response was incredible with 25 new members added to date.

To honor the past, present, and future members who have made such an extraordinary commitment, we formed the Grace Heritage Society, which is celebrated annually on All Saints Sunday with the induction of new members along with a tribute to existing members.

This endowment fund is invested in the Common Investment Fund of the Episcopal Diocese of Oklahoma.

- Estimated current balance: \$633,000.00
- All funds are unrestricted
- 100% unspent to date
- Funds allocated to the operating fund in 2025 = 5% (\$32,000.00)

## **OUR FINANCIALS**

## **Debt Free**

Grace recovered well following the pandemic and is financially sound. Pledging and attendance have increased significantly even in the absence of a priest on staff.


Budgeted Expenses for 2025 include salaries for a 3/4th time Priest and an Organist.

## **OURHOPES**

Church members have committed to having a full-time priest. To support this, our income needs to increase by \$65k annually for three years. Ongoing fund-raising has to date received commitments for \$57k annually for three years. This drive will continue and should easily raise \$70-\$75k by the end of the drive, allowing the hiring of a full-time priest. Grace has faith that an enthusiastic priest will help us bring the Word of God and Christ's Love into our community, which will bring more people into our church.

## OUR FUTURE

In preparing to conduct a search for a new Rector, our Vestry developed a survey that was distributed to members of our Parish to obtain their input on our strengths, our weaknesses, our past, our present, and most importantly, our future. The results encompass Grace Episcopal Church as it exists today.






