Dear Friends in Christ,

On behalf of the Vestry and Search Committee, I am thrilled to announce that after a focused search, The Rev. Omar Cisneros has accepted our call to be the next Rector of Grace Episcopal Church, Muskogee.

Fr. Omar comes to us from Christ Church Tulsa, where he served as Pastoral Fellow and Assisting Priest, guiding the parish through a time of transition following the sudden passing of the Vicar. He previously served as Curate at both St. Patrick's in Broken Arrow and St. Paul's Cathedral in Oklahoma City.

A graduate of Virginia Theological Seminary, Fr. Omar was ordained in 2022. Before entering ordained ministry, he worked in community organizing for nearly a decade and continues to bring a deep commitment to outreach and evangelism. Fluent in Spanish, he has served in both U.S. and Latin American ministry contexts.

He is married to Karina, and together they are raising their infant son, José Ignacio ("Nachito"). We look forward to welcoming them warmly into the Grace family.

The Vestry and Search Committee are filled with hope for this new chapter in the life of Grace. Fr. Omar will begin his ministry on June 9th, and his first Sunday with us will be June 15, 2025.

Dear people of Grace,

I'm grateful to begin my ministry as Rector.

From the beginning, I sensed something rare here. Not flash or perfection, but a quiet resilience. A desire to grow deeper in Christ. A hunger not for novelty, but for the real and living presence of Jesus Christ encountered in worship, in community, and in the rhythms of daily life.

What drew me to Grace was its longing to be shaped by the Gospel, not just in moments of triumph, but especially in the ordinary, faithful ways the Church lives and loves. That's the kind of community I want to serve.

We belong to a tradition where bread is broken, prayers are lifted, neighbors are fed, and Christ is met again and again. That's not sentiment; it's the heart of who we are. And it only takes root when we show up, pray deeply, listen well, and turn outward toward the city we're called to bless.

I don't believe the Church needs to reinvent itself. I believe it needs to remember who it is: a people gathered at the Table, listening for the Shepherd's voice, believing still that the Word became flesh and dwells among us.

That's the vision I see in Grace. And I'm honored to help build it with you.



- The meeting was called to order at 5:33 p.m. by Senior Warden Katherine Coburn with a prayer for vestry and a prayer for the search process.
- Reading & Approval of February 24, 2025 minutes. Motion to accept Joshua Chapman, 2nd Pam Lipscomb, motion carried.

B. Wardens' Reports

- 1. Senior Warden (Katherine)
 - a. Follow-Up Unfinished Business
 - 1) Updated membership list being worked on by Van, Nancy, BJ.
 - 2) Joshua is still unable to access the vestry portal. Tyler and BJ are attempting to access.
 - Social Media Alex Wilson/Nancy Scott/BJ Charbonneau Facebook administrators, new vestry members encouraged to decide which teams they want to work on. We need to update the staff profile and update vestry (remove 2025 class, add 2028 class).
 - 4) Vestry retreat tasks:
 - a) Van is working on an auction in fall 2025.
 - b) Recital flyer provided, updates will be made as needed and final copy distributed to schools, Zomac, etc. Someone will need to grant access.

- <u>A written finance report was provided</u>. Pledges for the month to date are behind. Quarterly statements are being prepared to help as a reminder. YTD total income is \$3300 over budget. March Expenses were higher due to insurance premium payment, but YTD expenses are under budget. Motion to accept Treasurer's report Joshua Chapman, 2nd BJ Charbonneau, motion carried.
- 2. Utilities are \$413 under budget year to date. We are going to disconnect the electric meter in Margaret's Garden until the garden is ready to be electrified (savings \$30/month). The hydrant in the public garden has a leak needing repair.
- 3. Full time priest fund is approaching its goal, pending a few more donor replies. The donations will be placed in the Stifel fund to receive better interest rates.
