From the Rector's Pen.

"Faithfulness in Small Things"

This past week, I stood alone in the sanctuary early in the morning, the hot summer sun gently bleeding through the stained-glass windows. There's a quiet holiness in those early hours. No hurried whispering of readers or servers as they find their places. Just stillness. The kind of stillness that reminds you that God often speaks not in the wind, or the earthquake, or the fire, but in the whisper.

I found myself reflecting on what makes a church flourish. Not just survive, but genuinely flourish. It is tempting, especially in our day and age, to measure vitality the way the world does, through numbers, metrics, clicks, and growth charts. And yes, those things can tell part of the story. But they are not the whole story. The Kingdom of God is rarely about the visible and dramatic. It is almost always about the slow and hidden things, a widow's mite, a mustard seed, a little leaven in the dough. In other words, faithfulness in small things.

We are living in a peculiar moment. Our culture moves at the speed of impulse. Patience is not rewarded. Humility is not admired. Commitment is often viewed as optional, and consistency is perceived as outdated. And yet here you are, Sunday after Sunday, week after week, praying, serving, making coffee, teaching children, showing up. Perhaps no one notices. But God does.

In one of his letters, the apostle Paul reminds us that we are "God's field, God's building." What a striking image. Not a factory or a machine, but a field. Which means that everything we do in this parish is agricultural work. And anyone who has ever farmed or gardened knows the nature of that work. It is patient, seasonal, and repetitive. You pull weeds that come back the next day. You water and wait, water and wait. For weeks, there has been no change. And then, almost miraculously, the first green shoots appear.

So much of parish ministry is like that. Faithfully pulling weeds and faithfully showing up and faithfully singing the same hymns, praying the same prayers, walking with the same people. We do it because God is at work, even when we cannot see it, especially when we cannot see it.

One of the beautiful things I have learned during my short time at Grace is that the most important ministry in a church is often the one that goes unseen. Someone prays for another parishioner daily without them knowing. Someone takes home the linens to wash. Someone replaces the candles. Someone puts away the bulletins left in the pews. None of this is included in the annual report. But I am convinced that the invisible faithfulness of the saints is what holds a church together.

It is a strange thing to say in a newsletter, but I will say it anyway. Holiness still matters. And holiness is not something only monks or mystics pursue. It is cultivated in homes, in hospitals, at kitchen tables, in committee meetings, in long email threads about the parish calendar. Holiness is formed when we decide that our worship matters, even when we are tired; that our prayers matter, even when we feel dry; and that our presence matters, even when we are unseen.

So, if you find yourself wondering whether your ministry matters, whether teaching that Sunday School class, praying for that person, or welcoming that newcomer is worth the effort, let me say plainly: it is. Our faith is not built on what we see. It is built on the promise that God is faithful and that God will finish what God began.

I want to thank all of you who are engaged in the unglamorous but vital work of parish life. Those who come early to unlock the doors. Those who stay after to clean up. Those who call, visit, or check in on someone who has been away from home. This is not extra. This is not behind the scenes. This is the Church.

As we enter this next season, I invite you to recommit to the small things. To not overlook the ordinary in search of the spectacular. God is often in the ordinary, if only we have eyes to see. Recommit to worship, to prayer, to hospitality, to learning, to forgiveness, to friendship. These are the seeds we plant, and in God's time, the Kingdom comes.

And if you are new to this community, having come for just a few weeks or a couple of months, please know this. There is a place for you here. You are not too late. You do not have to know everything. You are not required to have your life together. But you are invited to join us in this long and slow work of grace. We do not pretend to be perfect, but we are trying to be faithful. And we believe that is more than enough.



- The meeting was called to order at 5:35 p.m. with prayer.

- The meeting was called to order at 5:15 p.m. with prayer by Fr. Cisneros.
- Reading & Approval of June 2, 2025 minutes. Motion to accept Pam Lipscomb, 2nd Joshua Chapman, motion carried.

Reports of Wardens & Committees

- A. Rector's Reports Fr. Omar Cisneros
 - 1. Grace Updates enjoy being at Grace the past 3 weeks! Inspiring to see flexibility of the congregation.
 - a) Distributed a list of topics for discussion including office hours (Mon-Thurs 9-3), door system & cameras, repurpose space for ministry use, complete website & log redesign, establish system-based pastoral care email. Replace Church Windows with Church Center system, more user friendly and user interactive system.
 - Parish-wide Anglican course being searched for, weekly newcomer meetings, publicize office hours, polish Sunday service, reconnect with lapsed members. Fr. Clyde Glandon asked to have a conference here on October 18, 2025.

 - d) Sunday offering count & deposit change from mid-week deposit to Sunday count & deposit. We need a schedule put together of people who can perform this task.
- C. Finance (Van Odom)
 - 1.A written finance report was provided in advance. Income is \$741 over budget year to date. Pledge income and plate offering is in the black. Year-to-date expenses are under budget. \$56,008 donated to the new priest fund year to date. The Stifel balance is \$136,938. Utilities were below budget through May 31, 2025. Thank you cards were sent to new priest fund contributors. Insurance was paid in June which will change our expenses going forward. Motion to accept finance report Alison Miller, 2nd Pam Lipscomb, motion carried.

 - 1. Saturday Sextons next meeting is July 19. A church workday with an organized list and supplies is a better plan, and to get the scouts involved. A guarterly workday would be more effective.
 - 2. Electronic sign update waiting on parts to repair, service crew was here, repairs will take place when parts arrive.

Belltower update Wren Stratton and Jim Ebe met with Sr. Warden, corner of foundation appears to be sinking, recommended Shane Frix to see if he can find a footing to lift, then Travis Williams construction to take a look for additional potential work. Also get some drone footage which would help the construction team.

 Another chunk fell off the belltower exterior. Jim Webb has done roofing and he said the louver replacement would be expensive, just insert smoked glass in those openings. There are not any storm drains on our side of Court at the street. Avery Rigney (SP?) will be getting back with Katherine about the storm drain situation.
