Bishop: Will you who witness this new beginning support and uphold Omar in this ministry?


People: We will.

The Bishop, standing, says:


Bishop: Let us then offer our prayers to God for all his people, for this congregation, and for


Omar, their Rector.






For the holy Church of God, that it may be filled with truth and love, and be found without fault at the Day of your Coming,

# The Liturgy of the Word

#### The First Lesson: Isaiah 35:1-7

*Tyler:* A reading from the Prophet Isaiah.

The wilderness and the dry land shall be glad, the desert shall rejoice and blossom; like the crocus it shall blossom abundantly, and rejoice with joy and singing. The glory of Lebanon shall be given to it, the majesty of Carmel and Sharon. They shall see the glory of the Lord, the majesty of our God. Strengthen the weak hands, and make firm the feeble knees. Say to those who are of a fearful heart, "Be strong, do not fear! Here is your God. He will come with vengeance, with terrible recompense. He will come and save you." Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened, and the ears of the deaf unstopped; then the lame shall leap like a deer, and the tongue of the speechless sing for joy. For waters shall break forth in the wilderness, and streams in the desert; the burning sand shall become a pool, and the thirsty ground springs of water; the haunt of jackals shall become a swamp, the grass shall become reeds and rushes.

#### The Second Lesson: 2 Thessalonians 1:3-4

Brita: A reading from the second letter to the Thessalonians.

We must always give thanks to God for you, brothers and sisters, as is right, because your faith is growing abundantly, and the love of everyone of you for one another is increasing. Therefore we ourselves boast of you among the churches of God for your steadfastness and faith during all your persecutions and the afflictions that you are enduring.

Brita: The Word of the Lord. People: Thanks be to God.

Sequence Hymn: #448 O love, how deep, how broad, how high Please stand as you are able. (v. 1-3 before, v. 4-6 after Gospel)

The Gospel: Mark 7:31-37

Deacon: The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark.

People: Glory to you, Lord Christ.

Deacon: Jesus returned from the region of Tyre, and went by way of Sidon towards the Sea of

Galilee, in the region of the Decapolis. They brought to Jesus a deaf man who had an impediment in his speech; and they begged him to lay his hand on him. He took him aside in private, away from the crowd, and put his fingers into his ears, and he spat and touched his tongue. Then looking up to heaven, he sighed and said to him, "Ephphatha," that is, "Be opened." And immediately his ears were opened, his tongue was released, and he spoke plainly. Then Jesus ordered them to tell no one; but the more he ordered them, the more zealously they proclaimed it. They were astounded beyond measure, saying, "He has done everything well; he even makes the deaf to

hear and the mute to speak."

Fr. Omar: The Gospel of the Lord.
People: Praise to you, Lord Christ.

#### The Induction

Representatives of the congregation and of the clergy of the diocese stand before the Bishop with the new minister.

Representative of the congregation (Tim Holder) presents a Bible, saying:

Tim: Omar, accept this Bible, and be among us as one who proclaims the Word.

People: Amen.

The Bishop presents a vessel of water, saying:

Bishop: Omar, take this water, and help me baptize in obedience to our Lord.

People: Amen.

Presenter (Marlene Odom) presents a stole, saying:

*Marlene:* Omar, receive this stole, and be among us as a pastor and priest.

People: Amen.

Presenter (Joshua Chapman) presents a book of prayers, saying:

Josh: Omar, receive this book, and be among us as a man of prayer.

People: Amen.

Presenter (Pam Lipscomb) presents oil, saying:

Pam: Omar, use this oil, and be among us as a healer and reconciler.

People: Amen.

The Wardens (Katherine Coburn & B.J. Charbonneau) now present the keys of the church, saying:

Wardens: Omar, receive these keys, and let the doors of this place be open to all people.

People: Amen.

Representative clergy (Canon Betsy Randall) of the diocese present the Constitution and Canons of this Church, saying:

Cn. Betsy: Omar, obey these Canons, and be among us to share in the councils of this diocese.

People: Amen.

Other Representatives of the congregation (Pat Wilcox & D.I. Wilkinson) present bread and wine, saying:

Pat & D.I.: Omar, take this bread and wine, and be among us to break the Bread and bless the

Cup.

People: Amen.

The Bishop then says

Bishop: Omar, let all these be signs of the ministry which is mine and yours in this place.

People: Amen.

The new Minister kneels in the midst of the church, and says:

The new mineral mices in the mast of the enteren, that early

Fr. Omar: O Lord my God, I am not worthy to have you come under my roof; yet you have called your servant to stand in your house, and to serve at your altar. To you and to your service I devote myself, body, soul, and spirit. Fill my memory with the record of your mighty works; enlighten my understanding with the light of your Holy Spirit; and may all the desires of my heart and will center in what you would have me do. Make me an instrument of your salvation for the people entrusted to my care, and grant that I may faithfully administer your holy Sacraments, and by my life and teaching set forth your true and living Word. Be always with me in carrying out the duties of my ministry. In prayer, quicken my devotion; in praises, heighten my love and gratitude; in preaching, give me readiness of thought and expression; and grant that, by the clearness and brightness of your holy Word, all the world may be drawn into your blessed kingdom. All this I ask for the sake of your Son our Savior Jesus Christ. Amen.

The Bishop then presents the new minister to the congregation, saying

Bishop: Greet your new Rector.

The Congregation expresses its approval. Applause is appropriate. The Bishop greets the new minister. The new Minister then says to the people:

*Fr. Omar:* The peace of the Lord be always with you.

People: And also with you.

Then the Ministers and People may greet one another in the name of the Lord.


# The Great Thanksgiving

The people remain standing.

Sursum Corda: #S-120

Please remain standing.



The Celebrant proceeds:

Celebrant: It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give thanks to you, Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth. Because in the obedience of your saints you have given us an example of righteousness, and in their eternal joy a glorious pledge of the hope of our calling. Therefore, we praise you, joining our voices with Angels and Archangels and with all the company of heaven, who forever sing this hymn to proclaim the glory of your Name:

Sanctus: #S-125 Holy, holy, holy A Community Mass Proulx

The people sit, stand, or kneel. Then the Celebrant continues:

Celebrant: <sup>†</sup> Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself; and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all.

He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself, in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me." † † †

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me." † † †

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:

Celebrant & People: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

Celebrant: We celebrate the memorial of our redemption, O Father, in this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving. Recalling his death, resurrection, and ascension, we offer you these gifts.

Celebrant: Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son, the holy food and drink of new and unending life in him. Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom.

> All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ. By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. AMEN.

### The Lord's Prayer

Celebrant: And now, as our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to say,

Celebrant & People: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

The Breaking of the Bread

The Celebrant breaks the consecrated Bread. A period of silence is kept.

Celebrant: The Gifts of God for the People of God.

At Grace Episcopal Church, all baptized persons are welcome to receive Holy Communion. Please tell the usher if you need communion brought to you at your seat. IF you wish to receive the bread only, hold your palms upward, consume the bread, and cross your arms over your chest when the chalice bearer approaches. Those who do not wish to receive Holy Communion are invited to come to the altar rail to receive a Blessing, indicate this by crossing your arms over your chest when the priest approaches.
